Section-II

- In question No.5, original and organized attempt of Essay should be given from 13 to 14 marks. However simple attempt may also be awarded pass marks. Magic essays be discouraged please.
- In question No.6, correct and meaningful sentences for idioms should be given full credit.
- In question No. 7, flawless translation without any mistake / error of grammar / spelling should be given from 13 to 15. If there are certain errors, the whole passage should not be rejected.

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
